Israeli contractor helps out Uganda school

Solel Boneh International (SBI) Holdings, an Israel based road Construction Company has given out an assortment of school equipments to two Ugandan schools in a bid to improve education standards writes PAUL TENTENA.

The group, which was established in 1958, has since gained repute in all areas of civil engineering, development and construction.

It is currently working on many projects in Uganda including the Kampala-Masaka Rd (124 Km), Malaba/Busia-Bugiri Rd - 82 Km, Lubowa Housing Project -3000 housing units, Mbarara-Ntungamo Rd -EU Project -59 Km, Ntungamo-Kabale-Katuna Rd -EU Project - 65 Km, Mukono-katosi-Nyenga Rd -74 Km and Mukono-Kayunga-Njeru Rd - 93 Km.

They gave out computers, school desks, chairs, music instruments, playing materials to the Ntinda School of the Deaf and officially set up a computer lab at Little Light School found in Namuwongo. SBI also renovated and painted the pre-primary section of the Ntinda School for the Deaf. This was during the Good Deeds Day, which the company marked in Uganda.
